SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry, time is up. Senator Hudkins, on the second component of the divided question.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I would like to address my comments to Senator Hartnett, if he is available, if he could...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...

SENATOR HUDKINS: ...no question, I just want you to listen. You had made the comment that why do we need this, that this policy should be concerned about education and not activities. And that's what I would like to speak to. I think that this does concern the education because in more than just a few occasions, and you heard the number of schools that voted against this proposal, there is recruiting going on for purposes of we need another quarterback, we need another tall center, we need another whatever. And so, unfortunately, some schools are doing this. The schools also have to have deadlines to buy their books, to staff their rooms, to know how many bus routes they are going to have. And if they have a sudden influx of students at the very end of the year, it would be very difficult for them to do that advanced planning. So that is why they want these deadlines is so that by whatever the dates are we know how many kids are coming, and we don't want you to come to our school just because you're a terrific basketball player or a terrific musician. And, Senator Chambers, if you wanted to continue your comments back and forth with Senator Raikes, you may have my time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you have about...
