dealing that will change the price of these items after the publication of the fee schedule? It seems to me the school would have some kind of understanding with this outfit so there will not be a change of fee or price in midstream. So why do we need this word "maximum?"

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes. Senator, if I could give you one example, suppose...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, that might help.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...suppose we're talking about baseball shoes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR RAIKES: It's an extracurricular activity. We're making the student policy, fee policy in effect a year before...nearly a year before the baseball season may begin. Right now a pair of baseball shoes cost, I don't know, give me a number, 50 bucks. There is no intent on the part of the school to charge more than the actual cost for those schools...or for those shoes. On the other hand, if something happens, cattle prices get higher, that would be a good thing, something happens to cause the price of shoes to go higher, the school would need to cover its cost for shoes. Would not, it would not be to an advantage by being able to collect extra money because it can only use the money it collects for athletic equipment, to provide athletic equipment, but it would simply allow them to recognize the reality that the price of that particular item may change.
