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beginning. You have one activity but differing amounts depending on which level the person is participating, and you take the highest amount that any one of them would have to pay and list that as the maximum fee. That's what I'm being told is the way it goes and that was my original question. And if that is the way it goes, why should we do like that when that is not the fee that's actually going to be charged? If we want disclosure, why don't we specify what the fee is for the participation at the level the child is going to be participating? It has nothing to do with the change in prices. So the people are not together.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...on what this amendment means. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Raikes, you may continue.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Senator, I don't disagree with you on that. It is not my understanding of this provision that it would allow you to encompass several different items in one line on the fee schedule, so to speak, and then to simply describe the highest price for those several different items. Rather it would be that you would specify in detail exactly what item that you're talking about and then use the word "maximum" or use a maximum price only in the context that that price could vary. If you would like to ask additional questions, I'll yield you some time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Here's where you throw me, Senator Raikes. You mentioned that that will be the maximum in the sense that the price may vary. If I am the parent and my child is going to participate with the cheerleading squad, the reserve cheerleader cost for participation would be \$1,000. That is where my child is going to participate. But since the varsity cheerleader amount is \$1,500, then the fee that I see is \$1,500. Yet that's not what it costs for my child at the reserve level because that's \$1,000. So why do we even put the word "maximum" and not just leave it saying what the dollar amount of the fee is going
