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revisit it. That can be a valid position but the revisiting doesn't mean we have to change it and put something like this in statute, when as Senator Mines said, and on this I follow his philosophy, this should be administrative not legislative. We are being asked to micromanage in a way that the schools would not like in any other area, but you'll notice it's athletics. And I have told you all over and over the corrupting influence of athletics, not because of the kids who play it, but the adults...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...who exploit it. Even at the high school level, if you have a good team, a winning team, that brings kids to your school. Under this program, the receiving school gets money for those receiving schools. They benefit even when nonathletes want to come to their school. And if you beat that deadline, you don't have to get permission from the school you're leaving. It's just you and the receiving school. And the deal is cut, and if you pass this bill, you cannot uncut it. If they move before March 15, they are not ineligible to participate. We don't need to be doing this. I'd like to see the bill killed if this has to go along with it. If that other stuff about fees is necessary, it can be discussed on its own. But if this bill contains the language that's in it now about athletics, I'm going to fight against this like I fight against the NCAA because I see it not only corrupting the children...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Senator Hartnett, on the second component of the divided question to the committee amendments to LB 249.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Hudkins, Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Hudkins, (laugh) do you think recruiting goes just in your area of the state? (Laugh) No way, Jose. No way, Jose. It happens in the big cities too. But I think I...the only part that I disagree, I agree with what Senator Stuhr has in her bill in that after July the 1st, if you want to get Senator Janssen, this good hotshot football player over there, the quarterback, you have...and I'm a school district, you're a school district, we both have to sign off on him. To me that's
