good. It's giving...before it was up to March 15th, so it's giving the school districts, if they want to recruit a little longer period of time up to into July. The part that I have...the problem I have with the bill, Senator Hudkins, deals with the part here with the ineligibility because I think Senator Janssen, if he's that hotshot football player, he can't transfer from your school...from my school district to your school district unless I give him permission. He's stuck. He's stuck. And so that part I...that I agree with. I just don't agree with putting this other language in. I think the NCAA (sic), or the Activities Association, I hope I'm getting the right (laugh) number...or, the letters right, but I think that's where I'm at, Senator Hudkins. I think what she's got here is good. I...the...I have problems with the activities, and so if you want to respond, Senator Hudkins, you may.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may respond, Senator.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Mr. President and members, I agree with you, Senator Hartnett. I think, you know, there should be a deadline, and it was also called to my attention that students don't transfer just for extracurricular activities. They also transfer for better schools. So if...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, and I, yeah, yeah, yeah, but I think...but it also...it gives some teeth with that both school districts have to sign off, so, but I guess I'm having...that's my part is with for most of line 16 all the way down to 28, is that...

SENATOR HUDKINS: So you would rather just take out the reference to the ineligibility. After July 1, you don't move.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah. Eligibility, that I think is up to the school districts and the Activities Association, not up to us. But that's my opinion. Thank you. Thank you.
