SENATOR STUHR: No, I introduced the bill because I felt it was an important issue and, evidently, 240 other schools felt it was an important issue that we needed to address before the Legislature.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Stuhr, what they say doesn't mean anything to me, and you've said it about 240 times, (laugh) and I remember the number now. But just so I can be clear, if I don't like this part of the bill relative to the eligibility, you would rather I just put a kill motion on the bill and not try to retain only the committee amendment and strip out the rest of the bill. You'd rather the whole bill just be killed if something has to die. Is that your position?

SENATOR STUHR: Senator Chambers, I would like to see the entire bill go forward.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The whole bill, what?

SENATOR STUHR: I would like to see the entire bill advance.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But if it cannot move that way, then you'd rather it be all or nothing, that's what I'm saying.

SENATOR STUHR: I believe you are speaking as one person.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I'm asking...

SENATOR STUHR: And so we haven't had a chance to, you know, take a vote on the issue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But this is your bill. What is your preference? Or you...

SENATOR STUHR: I said before...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...don't want to state it right now.

SENATOR STUHR: ...I would like to see the entire bill advance.
