SENATOR CHAMBERS:      But short of that, you'd rather the whole bill be killed. If the whole bill can't go forward, you'd rather the whole bill be killed. Is that your position? I don't think she wants to talk to me anymore, but I still don't have an answer. I had questioned Senator Raikes. Senator Stuhr came over and said it's my bill, meaning hers. I said, okay, so I'm asking her the questions I put to Senator Raikes. Senator Raikes told me he's prepared to go forward with the bill if it had only the fees. So when Senator Stuhr told me it's her bill, I put the same question to her but she won't give me an answer. And if somebody else knows what her answer is, tell me. I asked her. If this stuff about eligibility was stripped out, in other words, the green part went away and the only thing that was left were the fees, would that be all right with her? All she would say, well, she wants the whole bill. And I said if you can't get the whole bill, then what? So she said a compromise. Well, my compromise will be not to try to amend the bill to keep only the committee amendment and the fees, but to offer a kill motion on the whole bill, and that should make...

SENATOR CUDABACK:      One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:      ...everybody happy. But in any case, I don't believe this bill should go forward as it is. We're being asked to micromanage because some schools are disputing. This doesn't have to be done statutorily. There is nothing in the statute right now that relates to this eligibility for extracurricular activities, and if it was, we wouldn't be putting in with the words underlined. We underline only that which is new. So if it's already there, we don't need it. If it's not there, we're trying to put it in. And since it's not there, I'm saying we should not put it there. Senator Mines is new, but I agree with what he said. Let them do it administratively, not legislatively. And if they're having all that trouble with it, and we're puzzling through it, it's not something worthy of our time, and we shouldn't clutter the statute with it.
