Others did talk about the impact on regular transferring students and how we're winding up with inconsistencies, but that's what happens when we try to do legislatively something that is not amenable to legislative action and need not be done legislatively. I'd like to ask Senator Stuhr a question and I don't know the answer to this one myself, so maybe I shouldn't ask it.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Stuhr, I heard a rumor. Is it true that NSAA is involved in some kind of lawsuit that would be affected by what we do on your bill?

SENATOR STUHR: I'm not sure that they will be affected, but I believe...I don't know if you were listening to my remarks previously about several court cases that have taken place, and that they...and we feel that it is important to have something in statute regarding eligibility.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I mean is there something pending right now, that's what I'm asking.

SENATOR STUHR: I believe that there is something pending right now, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And NSAA feels that there should be something in statute that would serve some beneficial purpose for them and that's why the bill was asked to be...you were asked to bring the bill. Is that true?

SENATOR STUHR: I...you don't...you won't want to hear this again about how many member schools really...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I'm just asking who asked you to bring the bill?

SENATOR STUHR: ...wanted the bill to be brought.
