SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Has there ever been a female or a minority group member on this board, to your knowledge?

SENATOR BAKER: I can't answer that. I don't know. I just don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if there is a representative from the public or of the public, would that person have to be in this area also, by that I meant a dealer in cars, trailers, motorcycles and so forth?

SENATOR BAKER: No, they would not.

SENATOR BAKER: There is one.
