FLOOR DEBATE

SENATOR BAKER: He's in the real estate business.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it is a he.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There are no females on the board right now. Is that correct?

SENATOR BAKER: Not that I can see from this list. I don't recognize anything as obviously being a female name, first name.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: From your experience, as the Chairperson, and maybe what you've picked up from being in the Legislature, is being male a legitimate qualification that should be required in order to be on this board?

SENATOR BAKER: No, that should not be part of it. It should not be a factor.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So the flip side is that being a female should not disqualify one from being on this board.

SENATOR BAKER: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If there has not been a female appointed to this board, do you think that is an oversight or an intentional desire to keep females off this board?

SENATOR BAKER: I certainly don't think that would be an intentional desire. I do need to point out that the Chairperson of this board is a female, the director of Department of Motor Vehicles, Beverly Neth. She is the Chairperson.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But that's just by accident of her having been head of a particular department, because if a man had been head of the DMV it would again be a man. She was not appointed to the board, in other words. She is on it by virtue of her position as head of DMV. Isn't that correct?

SENATOR BAKER: That's correct.
