Then there are those agitators who will look at a situation and, even if everybody who is in the picture is satisfied or appears to be, is content or appears to be, will not accept that as a suitable set of circumstances, because injustice inheres in it and injustice must be attacked wherever it is found. We have young children who are going to grow into teenagers, who are going to grow into young adults, and during that process they are conditioned to think, behave, and even believe in a certain way. If these young women who work in the Legislature as Pages and others who might be a bit older who work in these offices grow conditioned to the notion that there is a place for a female and that place is always a step or two behind a male, making somewhat or quite a bit less than a male in salary for doing the same work, they are not going to be the ones to challenge because they think that's the way it's supposed to be. If some of them think outside the box, so to speak, and are aware that that is not the way it is supposed to be, that being female does not carry with it the notion of inherent inferiority, they nevertheless can be fearful of trying to challenge the system, because another thing that happens to people who are accustomed to being kept suppressed and repressed...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is that a fear develops, a fear which is understandable, though regrettable. And the fear is that if you can be treated in such an unjust manner and nobody is going to speak against it, to whom can you turn for assistance if you speak? Is it wise to sacrifice yourself and your possible future opportunities to make what appears to be a futile, others would say futile, protest? Protest, protest, protest is what must be done when injustice is abroad in the land. But having lived as long as I have, observed as much as I have observed, I know what has become the quasi-nature of people in America.
