SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Beutler, you are recognized to open on
your amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Schimek, members of the Legislature,
this is, in my opinion at least, a technical amendment removing
some antiquated language. It's language that requires the
municipal clerk to certify the name of a purchaser on real
estate to the register of deeds in the county in which the
property is located. However, that's really not necessary
because the person who purchases the property is going to file a
deed and the tax information will be picked up from the deed,
and this particularly informative...this transfer of information
doesn't result in anybody doing anything. I checked it out with
our county assessor and he confirmed that. I think the League
of Municipalities is okay with it and I believe Senator Connealy
is okay with it. I would recommend that change to you. Thank
you.

SPEAKER BROMM PRESIDING

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Connealy.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. Yes, I do
agree. The underlying bill is to make more efficient processes
for second-class cities for disposing of personal property, such
as desks, clothing, food items, et cetera. Under the proposal,
the governing body would pass a resolution directing the sale
and post notices, and then if they have a weekly paper they'd do
that seven days prior to the sale. The purpose of the bill is
to make it more efficient. I think that Senator Beutler's
proposal and amendment fits in that, and so I would accept the
amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Connealy. Any further
discussion on the amendment? I don't see any. Senator Beutler,
you're recognized to close. He waives closing. The question
then is the adoption of AM1403. All in favor please vote aye,
and opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
