Because I'm not sure, the way your amendment was crafted, if we aren't then also adding the plain clothes investigators also having to now have...that don't have a requirement. I...if you could straighten me out on that, I'd appreciate it.

SENATOR BURLING: Yes. Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: Do you yield, Senator Burling?

SENATOR BURLING: This amendment would apply only to the licensed private investigators, not to the plain clothes men. The plain clothes investigators can be employed by an agency or someone else that has a private investigator license. So they don't have any requirement at all to be employed as a plain clothes investigator.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. Should I not be looking at the green copy then? Maybe I'm mixed up on where I'm at.

SENATOR BURLING: AM1034 (sic-AM0134) to LB 267 is the one we're working off of.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. All right. So the...I'm just going to spend a little time trying to sort this out.

SENATOR BURLING: Okay.

SENATOR THOMPSON: So you're only...the intent is not to get to...just to that one section, and amend the rule for that...or, there isn't a rule...state a rule for that in statute, but not deal with anything else?

SENATOR BURLING: Yes. Yes.

SENATOR THOMPSON: That's what you're attempting to do.

SENATOR BURLING: Yes.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. Thank you.
