SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I will then ask Senator Burling a question. Senator Burling, is it that you're unaware of whether this amendment covers both of those categories that Senator Thompson is asking about? Because I really don't know, but if you had the information, maybe you could resolve that for us.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Burling.

SENATOR BURLING: The way I understand it, it just involves the private detective that has the license, not the plain clothes man. Or, the applying...the applicant that's applying for the private detective agency license.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: For the agency license?

SENATOR BURLING: Not...the private detective agent license. You can have a license, an agency license, where you can hire other people, or you can have a private license where you just work for yourself and don't hire people.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, now, your constituent wants the license to do what? What is it that your constituent...?

SENATOR BURLING: He wants the...he wanted a private investigator's license to operate in the state of Nebraska.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is a private investigator different from a private detective?

SENATOR BURLING: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. So both of those...those both mean the same thing, right?
