SENATOR BURLING: As far as I know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I'm going to yield time to Senator Thompson. Mr. President, I'm yielding time to Senator Thompson.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Thank you. Senator Burling, I think I'm apples to apples now. And the section on page 2 of the amendment you're amending to, the first...it refers to the application shall be verified, blah blah blah blah,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Burling.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Sorry. I'm sorry.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Burling, do you yield to a question?

SENATOR BURLING: Yes.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. I'm sorry. Page 3. Section 2 says, "The secretary shall issue to the person if qualified therefor a nontransferable license to engage in the private detective business as a private detective, as a private detective agency, or as a plain clothes investigator in the State of Nebraska as follows". And then the section below that says...that you're amending, says, "the applicant". I would read that as "applicant" modifying Section 2, which includes the plain clothes investigator. I guess...I mean, to be honest with you, I'm not real...I'm not comfortable voting for this, but I do want to make sure that we know what we're voting for, for those who may wish to, that I see that as modifying the three licenses section, which would then put this 1,500-hour requirement to the licensee, because...to the applicant for this purpose. And I...you know, feel free to tell me I don't understand it. But I'm just confused.

SENATOR BURLING: Well, I can see where you can see that. And you know, it's a matter of interpretation. And I was assured, you know, as I went through this, that there were verbiages in the law that made my amendment apply only to the private
