SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear to open on AM1237 to LB 267.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. During the Enrollment and Review process, the Revisor of Statutes identified a needed clarifying technical change to one paragraph included within LB 267. The changes were not proper to be included as E & R amendments. As you will recall, LB 267 requires that an applicant for a liquor license or a private detective license submit fingerprints to be given to the Federal Bureau of Investigation through the Nebraska State Patrol for a national criminal history record check. The amendment strikes the current term "licensee" used in the bill, and assures that the statute reads that the "applicant" for a private detective license fulfill the requirements set forth in the act. The remainder of the paragraph is harmonized to reflect that change. The amendment does not alter the intent or the purpose of LB 267. And I would urge its adoption. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. You've heard the opening on AM1237, offered by Senator Brashear to LB 267. Open for discussion. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Brashear a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear, would you respond to a question from Senator Chambers?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Brashear, I was looking at something else. And it doesn't look like your amendment creates any problem. It just changes the word "licensee" to "applicant"? Is that because the word "licensee" would mean a person already has a license?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And would...the language that that is
