SENATOR BRASHEAR: A prospective, potential, or would-be licensee. So the better term of art is "applicant", somebody has completed an application, who doesn't have a license.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Or is characterized without regard to whether they have a license.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I thought that when I looked at it. But again, I was occupied otherwise. And based on what Senator Burling almost slipped through, I thought I'd better just be sure that hidden in here somewhere is not a reduction in the number of hours. Can you assure me that...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I understand. I understand. This is a terribly complex and difficult bill that has elicited a great deal of debate.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Laugh) Okay. Thank you. That's all that I have.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brashear, there are no further lights on. He waives the opportunity to close. The question before the body is adoption of the Brashear amendment, AM1237 to LB 267. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on adoption of AM1237 to LB 267. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Brashear's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was successful. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Baker. Senator, I understand you want to withdraw AM1281.
