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respect to the division of powers, with respect to creating offices. But I think there is good, solid legal opinion backing up the way that everything has been done in this particular amendment. I don't have any real concerns in that regard. But the administrator is not just going to be any person. This administrator, under the provisions of the bill, will be a person who has a bachelor's degree, or a degree in architecture from a university, who has had a number of years' experience in historic preservation, planning, and design. The primary functions of the office would be with respect to facilities planning, facilities construction, and facilities administration. It is limited to the State Capitol and the Capitol grounds, that is, the grounds on this very four-block area. Doesn't include the Governor's mansion, does not include any other buildings in or around the Capitol. The original bill did, in case any of you might have heard that. This amendment does not. And then the bill goes on to lay out in a little more detail the duties of the Capitol Administrator, those different kinds of decisions where the advice of the Capitol Commission will be sought. It goes on to describe that the Governor shall appoint the administrator. The Governor will continue to appoint three of the members of the commission, as well as, of course, sitting on the commission himself or herself. And I believe that with those details, I have described to you most of the important parts of the amendment. On page 21, in case you're interested, is the retained language that is primarily, of course, Senator Hudkins' portion of the bill, describing the relationship of the State Patrol to the Capitol building. If you're interested in the composition of the commission, it's described on the bottom of page 27. We did add to the commission the director of the Nebraska Historical Society, because history is such a very important part of this bill. But that is the only thing, if I'm recalling correctly, that we changed with regard to the composition of the commission. The most important part of the commission aspect of the bill is simply being sure that the Speaker of the Legislature, on behalf of the Legislature, is intimately involved in the decision making, in...
