record information check to the State Patrol Cash Fund, and the remaining amount to the General Fund. Concern: If we have to test eyesight, check around our office and other law enforcement offices concerning habitually drugged, intoxicated, under investigation, et cetera, the fee will not cover the cost. Are fees charged for revised permits, address changes for instance, and replacement fees for lost or stolen permits? Under identifying information on page 6, lines 20 through 21, Section 6, paragraph (4), the permit shall list the permit holder's name,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...address, and expiration date of the permit and contain a photograph of the permit holder. Concern: Should there be a requirement that the permit holder maintain a permit with his or her current name and address? Are there penalties for failing to keep the name and address current? Restrictions on access, page 10, line 17, page 11, line 10, Section 12, paragraph (1)(a), a permit holder may carry a concealed handgun anywhere in Nebraska, except establishment having a license issued under the Nebraska Liquor Control Act that derives over one-half of its total income from the sale of alcoholic liquor. Concern: Will a list be available for a permit holder and a peace officer designating the establishments in Nebraska that derive over one-half of its total income...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...from the sale of alcoholic liquor? Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Tyson, this will be your third time, Senator.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I don't really know where to start, but I'll start on the last about how do you determine whether an establishment derives 50 percent of its income from the sale of alcoholic liquor.
