SENATOR SCHIMEK: So...

SENATOR TYSON: That's a business.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...so would a state chamber of commerce office be an establishment?

SENATOR TYSON: Yeah, and if they wanted...if they wanted no concealed weapons there, they'd put a sign there, no concealed weapons, and it's within the law that you can't go in there with a gun, with a concealed weapon.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, so it would be up to the individual establishment to take the initiative to put the sign up.

SENATOR TYSON: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Could I...could I put such a sign up in my own home?

SENATOR TYSON: Certainly.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Is there anything...is there any place at all that you couldn't put such a sign up?

SENATOR TYSON: Where you could not put it up?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR TYSON: City streets I would imagine.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So the city streets are the one place that there would be no prohibition either by law or by someone taking...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...the initiative and putting the sign up.
