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don't use it, I won't articulate it. I started that complaint with Dear Mr. Chief Justice, "F" you. And I wrote it out. I said, now you're not going to let a lawyer address you like that, so no judge is going to address an attorney like that. And although the complaint had been dismissed when the complaining female lawyer brought it, it was taken seriously when I brought it. And the judge was publicly disciplined. His name was Hartigan, if you don't believe me. And his public comment was that he is a better judge for it. So you all hear these judges tell you things and you won't pursue it. I want my colleagues to know, so when you observe judges misbehaving in the courtroom they are not allowed with impunity to violate the law. Now they can do it. They can commit an unlawful act, but they can be called to account. And when I become aware of it, I will call them to account because I don't accept all this claptrap that we're being told here. Senator Tyson is not lying to you. He just does not know. And how can he know if he is not taught? And if he spends all his time around people who don't know anything, they cannot teach him. The only one able to teach is one who knows, and I know. And you know...you want me to tell you how I know? Not because the Bible tells me so. Not because some little bird whispers in my ear, I hear voices. I take these dull statutes, these dull court cases, that dull judicial conduct ethical code and I read them word by word, over and over and over, and then I apply those words to the conduct of judges...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...who are mistreating people who cannot defend themselves, and then I file complaints in their behalf. And if Senator Tyson is interested, I can give him probably at least a half-dozen judges by name that I have gotten disciplined for mistreating people. They should not misuse that power. If judicial power can corrupt, you know the false sense of power a person would have who's carrying a pistol. You know what that kind of false sense of power can do and the problems that it can cause. And Senator Tyson's comment about the wrongful things judges can do should let you know what these people, with even less control than judges will have, can do with a concealed lethal weapon.
