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5 cents goes to something called the Building Renewal Allocation Fund. We're not done yet. Fourth, 13 cents goes to the Nebraska Capital Construction Fund. Fifth, there's the MIRF funds that Senator Chambers brought out, a \$3 million figure. It's not a cent figure. It's \$3 million a year goes to the Municipal Infrastructure Redevelopment Fund Act. Sixth, 2 cents goes to something called the Information Technology Infrastructure Fund. And then in that also there's a \$1 million home...hold harmless. That's actually the seventh portion that goes to the Primary Class Development Fund, City of the Primary Class Development Fund. Eighth,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: ...\$1.5 million goes to the Metropolitan Class Development Fund. And finally, ninth, 28 cents goes to the Cash Reserve Fund. One thing that I thought was interesting too is in the amendment all of the other portions of the amendment go to make it permanent. But for ninth, that seems to go .way October 1 of '04. My question is, is that when we're dealing with all of these different little earmarks, when everything is supposedly on the table, are any one of these earmarks, I think the question that we need to ask, are any one of these earmarks more important than the priorities that we're going to set forth for the state of Nebraska? And I guess I'd ask you to ask yourself that question. Are any one of these nine earmarks more important than education? Are any one of these nine...

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: ...earmarks more important than Health and Human Services?

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. I weighed in because, first of all, I appreciate what Senator Quandahl brought to us because I think it's something we need to take a good hard look at, because many of us, when these funds are distributed, don't know much about some of these, as
