With that, I had passed out a chart that's entitled "Revenue Items" at the top, but it lists all the different bills that have been filed this session that provide revenue of one kind or another in different amounts, and it's a kind of menu you can look at and go through the scenario of how you reach \$300 million of revenue, if that's in your mind what you want to reach, or how you reach \$360 million if that's what you want to reach. You can put these things together in different combinations and see if there are any combinations that satisfy you. But that's the sheet that shows you, on the outside, the total amount of revenue that might be raised from all of the different bills that have been filed, of everything that's available to us this session. And in fact, it doesn't include a couple of sales tax expansion items that might be available to us, but by and large, it includes everything that I think people have been talking about and thinking about. So you might want to give that some perusal to further define your thoughts about which sources are appropriate from your perspective. And hopefully Senator Landis can respond with respect to the intent of the Revenue Committee with regard to supplying an additional revenue bill. Thank you.
