into them. But I know whenever I talk on financial matters, people tend to dismiss it and say that I don't know anything. If you want to do the right thing, do it now, and if we all croak the record will be favorable toward us. That's all that I have to say, Mr. Speaker. I would ask for a call of the house, and I will accept a machine vote, but I want it to be a record vote. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers has requested a call of the house. All in favor of the house going under call please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER BROMM: The house is under call. Members, please report to your seats and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call.
