back to this some day. We didn't have enough voices or enough votes the last time to derail this proposal that now we're back, we're back looking at it again. It was a bad thing to do at that time and it's still a bad thing. We needed that money for the infrastructure throughout the state and, with the 309 Maintenance Committee, that's where the money was supposed to go back to. It didn't. It went to Lincoln and Omaha. And I just wish Senator Wickersham was still here so he could get in on this discussion also. The ditch and the mud flats, you're right, Senator Hudkins, you're absolutely right. Senator Chambers, I am going to support your amendment and I wish that we could put the rest of that section in also. The city of Omaha and the city of Lincoln have received this money, I think, for two years now, and it's time to...that everyone provides a little help for the rest of the state...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...so that, I think, is a good amendment and I'm going to support it. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, my amendment is an amendment to an amendment, so it cannot be amended. But that doesn't stop anybody else from offering any amendment he or she chooses. I said I'm offering representative amendments. Anything else anybody else sees that the cigarette tax money is going for which they think it ought not to go for, offer an amendment to strike that from the existing law in the way that I'm doing. Omaha, in order to get this money, has to pledge to spend several millions of dollars on that sewer separation project. I don't know that they can back away from that, whether they get this money or not, but local pressure can be brought to bear to show that that money ought to be expended for that purpose. So I'm suggesting very strongly that you adopt my amendment. Then anybody who wants to go after that Omaha money can offer an amendment. The item Senator Beutler talked about, wastewater treatment and so forth, are not even implicated here because we're talking about earmarked cigarette tax money. I could show a health
