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consideration on that sewer separation project. That's so that you can carry water away, nasty water, so it won't come in people's houses and cause diseases by backing up. But if you think that money should not be coming out of cigarette tax money, offer the amendment. And I'm not going to be angry with anybody for offering any amendment. I stated that we're showing the things that we believe ought not be on the table. I had said when I started this project that I'm not going to offer an amendment to take each and every one of these subject areas out of the current law; that I would select the ones I thought should be taken out. And that's what I have done. In addition to this amendment, I have two others up there. One would take some money from some information technology infrastructure, this, that and the other boondoggle. The last one would go to that portion in the law which cuts off the date when money will go into the General Fund. My amendment would just say that starting October 1, 2002, 28 cents will go into the General Fund and not, as the language says, starting in 2002 and continuing to whatever that date is, which means when that second date was reached that amount of money would not go into the General Fund. Those are the two remaining amendments besides this one that I have up there. On this division of the question, I will not offer other amendments. Other people can do as I do--offer amendments. But once I offer them, I can be questioned, interrogated, and I will answer any questions that are put to me. These amendments give others the opportunity to either discuss them, the bill itself, the budget bill, the appropriations process, or anything else related to the thing that is looming over all of our proceedings this session; that is, the budget. I come down here every day anyway. I'd be happy, Senator Mines,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to have in the middle of the dog days of August or summer, whenever they come, a lot of my colleagues down here with me. I mean you walk through these halls and you don't see anybody, and your foot prints...steps actually echo.
