SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think we'll spend a few more days thinking.
(Laugh)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That...thank you, Senator Wehrbein. That's a good, safe answer. I'm going to see that we spend some more days, not just thinking,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...but talking. I want us not just to think; I want us to cogitate. That's what I want us to do. And we shall. It's almost amusing. Because I think, in a general way, all of us have a notion of what we're going to have to do, and we're not doing it. Adopt my amendment and we'll be starting in that direction. It will show that we're serious. But if you can't touch these things where we're not increasing a tax, where we're not cutting a people program, then you're surely not going to do what needs to be done, and we'll be back here for a special session. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body, I was going to give a very brief discussion of what the money is presently used for. The NIS project, which is Nebraska Information Project, our accounting system uses \$1.9 million of that, and this is an ongoing project. I cannot, at this point, go into great detail on this, but it's been a project that was started a couple of years ago. It's a very wide...let's see, what shall I say...all-encompassing accounting process that we just now went on within the last few months, and I think it's going to be something that's going to be continuous. It's going to provide a lot more information for detail analysis, record keeping, looking into many of the details that we need for analysis of our budget into the future. So it's a very valuable tool that this is...that the cigarette tax was chosen to finance that. Some of the other money goes for community grants, as goes through our chief information officer that does the granting of these. This money goes for library information
