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treating them all the same, we show our seriousness of purpose. We let people who have been able to rock along and become complacent, feeling that they are never going to face legislative scrutiny, be disabused of that position, and realize that they are going to have to get in this fight too. Senator Brashear is not spreading the pain around as widely as it ought to be spread. These programs have nothing about them that entitles them to be exempt from our scrutiny. Take them all out. And if compelling reasons can be shown why they ought to be put in this favored, protected category, let us do it. There are people I feel ought to be protected, people who because of their sexual orientation are discriminated against mercilessly. And my colleagues continue to say, they should not be a protected class. Those are people,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...human beings; these are programs. But you want to put them all in a protected class. Every one of these items is in a protected class, and Senator Foley agrees that they should be protected. He can relate to programs, but he cannot relate to suffering human beings. And he's not alone in that. Senator Foley cannot frustrate my efforts to bring justice by himself. He's just the one willing to be out there at the tip of the spear. But, Senator Foley, you and I know there's a long, thick shaft behind you who feel just the way you feel but they won't stand on the floor and say it. But I know what their attitudes are. And I tie these things in. You want these programs to have a special protected status. And some of these programs, you don't even know what they are. And you want to tell me that this legislative body is...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...competent to handle our budgeting process? Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, there are no further lights on wishing to speak at this time. And that was your third time. But you are recognized to close on your amendment, FA1331, if you care to.
