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dollars each fiscal year of proceeds of such tax into the General Fund.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What page are you on? Page 1?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: It doesn't have a page.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I'm in...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is this new lang...?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...FA1326.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it is new language?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: It is new language.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And when you get to that, then you can...you know, I'll accept that.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Members of the Legislature, how many really know what is in Senator Brashear's bill? Or does it make any difference? Are we just looking at the amount that is to be raised in the tax? Or are we aware of the steps and stages that are gone through to get that total amount that might wind up in the General Fund? I'd like to ask Senator Wehrbein another question, if he's willing to answer.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, are you willing?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, is it anticipated that by October 1, 2004, there's not going to...there will be no need to put any additional money into this rainy day fund? It will have all the money that it needs at that point?
