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SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Chambers, I consider these proposals. I think we need to probably debate the spending bill, the appropriations bill first. I consider this a work in progress. Whether it should go where...savings account, whether it should go General Fund is yet to be determined. I guess some of it will depend on our attitude toward the end of May. If...frankly, I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you...and I'm going to put you and me in the same boat for a second. You feel, as I do, that we should not necessarily agree that as of October 1, 2004, no additional money goes into the Cash Reserve Fund. We're not making that determination here today.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Not in the final analysis. There is a...I tend to think it might be appropriate to go to General Fund, so I'm hedging...I'm not really saying.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But at the present time, I'd be willing to put it into Cash...into the General Fund. Part of it is, is what extent we may want to look at the Cash Reserve Fund here in another three weeks.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Mr. President, as long as there are people who are going to look at these very serious issues, I feel less concern, because it means more than one pair of eyes is looking. There will be more than one set of lungs participating, I believe. And I think we should not be too quick to just accept what is presented to us, without being aware of all the ramifications. Was that my third time, Mr. President, on this one?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You're still opening, Senator Chambers, on your amendment, FA1332.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Laugh) See what you've done to me? Thank you, Mr. President.
