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SENATOR CUDABACK:    One minute.

SENATOR KREMER:    ...somebody else.    And it...the problem I have with all this is that it gets so complicated.    And I guess...I'm not sure...Senator Brashear, would you answer a question for me, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK:    Would you respond to a question, Senator Brashear?

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    Yes, Mr. President, if I can.

SENATOR KREMER:    Okay.    After we get done with the exemptions of \$1,000 for ag land property, and \$500, I think, for homestead exemption, how much more money will this generate?    Of course, we don't know what all the consequences are going...

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    I always use the disclaimer...somebody will...

SENATOR KREMER:    ...to be on the amendments and everything, so...

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    ...get at me.    But I always use the disclaimer, I use round numbers.    That's a \$50 million savings, net.

SENATOR KREMER:    Net...?

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    Net savings for the state.    Costs \$50 million less to provide the \$5,000 homestead exemption...

SENATOR KREMER:    Okay.    Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    ...and the \$1,000 ag land credit.    Costs \$50 million less...

SENATOR KREMER:    Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR:    ...than the way we're doing it now.
