ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the motion to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Debate does cease. Senator Landis, you're recognized to close on your amendment, AM1429, if you care to.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature. Remember, these were suggestions from the Department of Revenue for technical "doability," for technical efficiency. Now, they do represent some policy choices. I think Senator Raikes has identified a better way to operate than what we now do. It would improve on existing law. I think Senator Baker wants to take a look at a different list of the animals that are treated certain ways. But as a baseline, I would suggest that we adopt this amendment, and then make whatever amendments to it that we wish to. However, I think we'd advance it if we simply take the Department of Revenue at face value when they say these amendments would make the bill easier to administer. I ask for the adoption of AM1429 to FA1327.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. You've heard the closing on AM1429, which is an amendment to the third component of divided committee amendments offered by the Revenue Committee to LB 759. All in favor of that amendment vote aye, and opposed nay. The question before the body is adoption of the amendment offered by Senator Landis to the third component of the divided committee amendments. Have you all voted who care to? Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Landis' amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment has been adopted. Mr. Clerk.
