states do not. Again, looking...I believe Senator Brashear even made the statement that most of the repair was done on vehicles. Again, those people who can't afford the newer vehicles, those are the ones that again we're concentrating this additional tax on. Most of my constituents have told me that they would just prefer extending, if we have to do something, to extend the present tax that we have. Looking at the one sheet that was provided, I'm not sure if it was provided by the Appropriations or the Revenue, if we extend the present tax, sales tax, without broadening, we have the opportunity of raising \$180 million in revenue. Looking at these new taxes of broadening, from what Senator Brashear has handed out, it's \$74 million, just looking at that comparison. Also looking at the yellow sheet, I have to look at the bottom tax. When it says comparing the other states to the base sales tax rate, one state, if you look at the option taxes, which those are generally what most of the residents are paying, we have one state that is lower. We have one state that is exactly the same as ours, Iowa. Otherwise, all of the rest of the states are higher when you look at that combination of using that option tax. I'm going to continue to listen to the debate. I also agree, I think there are really some difficulties in taxing, placing a tax on snacks. I think we went through this last year, what percent of sugar, what percent of flour, how do we really determine that? I'm not just looking at the simple thing to do but I'm looking at what, in comparison to...
