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SENATOR JANSSEN: No, because that is initiated by the people in this state.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, but if the Legislature put something on the ballot, Senator, and a casino and I think it was...the Venetian was used too. The Venetian wanted to advertise to promote the activities of a casino, in other words to promote a petition ballot issue.

SENATOR JANSSEN: It says advertising activities of a casino; activities, promote the activities of a casino. That is the working activities of that casino. That would...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: You may be right but I'm just saying I think this language leaves it a little bit questionable.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I believe that says it right there, those activities of a casino, which, what is the activities of a casino if it isn't slot machines, and crap games, so on and so forth?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Those are the activities. Now if the Venetian or anyone in Las Vegas, which they have sometimes and I have promoted tours or flights to, yes, if they were based in Las Vegas, it doesn't just mean the states that surround us.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Oh, I know that.

SENATOR JANSSEN: But any gaming.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I know that. Okay. It's on the record now, at least.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you.
