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SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Baker. We're now on discussion of AM1464. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, Senator Baker, you're recognized to close on your amendment. He waives closing. The question then is the adoption of AM1464. All in favor vote aye and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Baker's amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendment is adopted. Next item on the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Connealy would move to amend the committee amendments with AM1454. (Legislative Journal page 1386.)

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Connealy, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. As I stated when we brought up Senator Brashear's previous amendment, this deals with the public power end of the clarifying amendment we adopted earlier. Because it was an amendment to an amendment, we couldn't amend that. So later I put this in. In the rehabilitation...in the restoration and reconstruction or replacement of structure damaged or destroyed by fire, flood, tornado, lightning, explosion, or earthquake, I would remove "earthquake" and put in, "ice storm, or other natural disaster." Natural disaster would be covered by...earthquake would be covered by that natural disaster language. And in more clearly defining what power systems do, I added "distribution" to the list in (f), which, "construction, repair or annexation of any structure used for generation or transmission of electricity" would read "generation, transmission, or distribution of electricity." I'd ask for the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Connealy. Is there any discussion on AM1454? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Connealy, could you elaborate a little on what "natural disaster" means? I mean, for example, is a
