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and tries to live off the income, and he pays taxes as long as he owns it. His neighbor sells all of his land and invests in tax-free bond and doesn't pay any taxes. And we've allowed that to happen for years. And I suspect we're going to continue to let it happen. These are the kind of scenarios that makes this whole process so difficult, and in many instances, in the eyes of many, makes it unfair. But be that as it may, this is one of the problems that I see with this kind of approach, where we try to fashion some kind of legislation in a one-size-fits-all fashion, and it just doesn't happen. The problem we're...this is just one example that I have been concerned about, because we're not going to do anything for that young man who wants to go out there and get in agriculture, because we're not giving him any benefits that we're going to give those other people who are already out there. So I have a problem with that, along with some other parts that I'm not going to address right now because I don't think I have the time, and I want to get part way through the discussion. But I did want to mention this, because I think it's very important to some of the young people in this state who I've talked to, who...and in my particular case, who I've assisted in trying to get into the field of agriculture, help them to let them farm my land. But they're not going to get benefit. And the guy next to them, who has the money and can raise the money, and buys the land, and farms it, he's going to get that benefit. Now, I'm not complaining because I don't get the benefit. Well, I'm complaining because I own the land and I still have to pay taxes on it. But I don't get anything back on these kind of credits. So I'm not going to support this amendment to this kind of legislation, because personally, I don't think it's fair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR VRTISKA: I think it's being...I think it's an unfair way to approach a problem that we all see. And certainly I do, certainly, along with Senator Raikes and others, admire Senator Brashear's work on this kind of legislation, trying to solve a problem that we're all aware of, and that is the price of...the cost of doing business and the taxes we have to pay and how they're...how the money is distributed and who pays it. So with that, Mr. President, I'll turn the rest of my time back to the
