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Governor? You think they're not going to be getting instructions from lobbyists? You think lobbyists have not done their work to get some of that stuff adopted that the Legislature has already chosen to add to this bill? You think people did that out of the goodness of their heart or because they...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...believed in the bill? I even backed off some because Senator Bourne said there was something in it that would help MUD. And I didn't say a lot on a part of it that I might have said something on. But that doesn't mean I'm going to support the bill all the way over there. And I'm making it clear where I stand. And maybe if everybody would be as forthright and honest as I'm being, you'd see what trouble LB 759 is in, and you might consider it a victory to keep what Senator Bourne referred to as a package together, and move it over there. Go read what a Pyrrhic victory is. Read what a Pyrrhic victory is. It's like shooting your wad, and you win a battle. Then when time comes for the real contest, you have nothing left. You've got a whole lot of guns with no bullets. You've got airplanes on the ground, but no fuel. You've got missiles with no motors. That's what we're going to have on Select File. Those who have these segments of the bill that they love, let them go around and do what they do and count votes and see how many they've got, and see if any one of them has 33 votes. What they hope for is that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...by keeping this as a package, as they call it, ...thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers and Senator Tyson. Senator Landis. Senator Landis? Excuse me.
