SENATOR JANSSEN: Right.

SENATOR RAIKES: So that additional 30 percent goes...has to be paid for out of the school's general fund budget, and that part, I mean schools really have little option in terms of their special ed funding. There's an IEP per student...

SENATOR JANSSEN: They have no choice.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...and so they need to do that. To the extent that those expenses increase faster than the budget lid, it's not a problem because they are exempted from the budget lid, even though schools do have to pay for it. But then, because of our state aid formula mechanism, that shows up two years later in terms of expenses and so on and so forth.

SENATOR JANSSEN: None of that is changing.

SENATOR RAIKES: Pardon?

SENATOR JANSSEN: None of that will...

SENATOR RAIKES: No. We, in fact, we are...we have gone out of our way to maintain that special ed funding mechanism as it currently is.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Raikes. I'll give you the rest of my time.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: All right. Just to correct myself, the environmental...the 5.2 cent levy provision that's now in law would cover environmental hazard abatement, accessibility barrier elimination, and qualified academy bonds. Those are currently allowed. What we're proposing here would be to do the three additional ones: mold, indoor air quality, and fire safety codes. So thank you for the time, Senator, and I'll stop there.
