\$14 billion in Central. And they have campuses, obviously, right along the border of each one, Columbus I think, Grand Island, so on, et cetera. There's no problem in combining them. I think even their executive director out here behind the glass has agreed to look at this. So...and it's not the only...there's precedent for doing this. I think we started out with eight community college areas in the state. We're down to six. To be all honest...in all honesty, I think Mid-Plains and Western might want to look at doing the same thing here down the road. And that's what I propose to do, is talk to those people during the interim, see if we can't come up with something also with Mid-Plains and Western, combine some administrative costs, cut some administrative costs, I should say, make them more efficient. And certainly we need to look at two community college areas there that are...border each other. one of them has twice the valuation as the one...as Northeast. And I, too, defend Northeast Community College. We send a number of young people from our area to Norfolk for their lineman training program. And it's a valuable program, and I tend to agree with Senator Janssen. Those young people, their tuition is paid for by local fire...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...districts, and I think they'd probably pay about whatever it took to get them through that program. I think it's the only one in the Midwest like it. So I'm looking down the road, a more permanent solution to this. And I think with the AG's Opinion that we have back, we can go ahead and do it. And I pledge to work on it during the interim. Because it's not just Northeast and Central I'm looking at, it's Western and Mid-Plains. So I think that is the solution. I believe my light is on next. Is that correct?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is.

SENATOR BAKER: I would just turn my light off, I guess, and I would yield the base...or rest of my time back to the Chair. Thank you.
