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SENATOR TYSON: Thank you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: About two and a half minutes.

SENATOR TYSON: ...very much, Senator Engel. Ladies and gentlemen, Senator Synowiecki read a portion of the editorial opinion of the Norfolk Daily News. And that part was, additional state revenues would need to replace lost tax dollars. As far as I know, there's no special situation there. Those dollars would have to be appropriated, and that appropriation would have to come from here. So were that to arise, the solution is right here in the Unicameral. We have an ongoing enterprise there that's of value. It needs temporary help. It's up to you whether they get that temporary help or not. They're doing a very good job. Senator Janssen might be interested to know that they have raised the tuition. And that tuition is a small portion of what it would be here at the University of Nebraska, and that really doesn't enter into it. They're trying to keep the tuition on the 20-20-40 basis that has been stated as the intent of this body. Now it's going to be up to you as to whether this ongoing successful enterprise, which is...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR TYSON: ...selling a good product to the benefit of all of us, can be helped along, not with your tax dollars; with my tax dollars. I'm raising my taxes. Senator Jones is raising his taxes. Senator Maxwell, Senator Engel, Senator Connealy, Senator Cunningham. Our taxes are going up, not yours. So don't say, we are throwing money at it. No. What this body can do is give 20 counties out of 93 the ability to raise sufficient monies to keep their ship on a level keel, and keep providing the taxes...pardon me, keep providing the product that they have, the education of people from northeast Nebraska, and as Senator Baker pointed out, the people from...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR TYSON: ...all over the state of Nebraska. Don't be
