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SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, Senator Raikes, I think you said, as I look at your amendment here, that it's mostly technical. I think the other part is this change or the change in policy of dealing with a loss or damages. Is that something new...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...in the statutes? I think I agree with it. I just raise the question, Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, thank you, Senator. It just simply makes it clearer that collecting...the school, the ability, if you will, to collect for lost or damaged property does not have to be specified as a part of the student fee policy.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So they can have this, it's a blanket policy?

SENATOR RAIKES: That is, yes.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah, okay. Thank you. Thank you for the explanation.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator. Are you through, Senator Hartnett? Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I just wanted to comment on Section 5 of the amendment which deals with that this act does not prohibit a governing body from permitting students to supply materials for course projects. I think it's important that we have that stated and it also allows the governing body to request donations of money, materials, equipment, or attire to defray costs if the request is made in such a way that it is clear that the request is not a requirement. And I think that's an important part that have been included in the amendments. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Senator Raikes, there are no further senators wishing to speak. You may close on AM1380, if you care to.
