SENATOR ENGEL: (Laugh) I bet you could.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, that's all I have.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Senator Engel. I was just thinking how I could explain this, because I know it's fairly hard for you to understand and this whole process is similar to where we are here as legislators. We produce...I think Senator Raikes probably has golden eggs, and maybe Senator Tyson has kind of hard-boiled eggs, and maybe Senator Landis would be colorful Easter eggs. And after eight years we're going to be called spent legislators, and what good is a spent legislator? What can you use it for? And I thought, well, they could probably be extruded into the lobby and a useful product called a lobbyist then would be from there, and there they could produce more heat and pressure and it would be something useful then. So thank you. That's all I have to say.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kremer. Any further discussion on the Engel amendment, AM0629? Seeing none, Senator Engel, you're recognized to close, if you care to.

SENATOR ENGEL: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. First of all, I'd like to thank Senator Kremer and the members of the Ag Committee for the good hearing they had and restructuring the actual bill itself so it would comply with the concerns of all concerned. (Laughter) And so...but I'm not ready to jump into the slurry with the bow on top, what will you call it. So anyhow, I appreciate everything and I appreciate your vote in advancing this to Final Reading. Thank you.
