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SENATOR CUDABACK: There is one light on. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback. Senator Kremer, if I could just run one thing by you a little bit, if I could, on LB 735, and I was just reading it this morning and I'm sorry I didn't have an opportunity to forewarn you of the question, but here's what I wanted to ask you about. With regard to the new requirements on the grain warehousemen, there's some things they have to go through, like criminal history checks and fingerprinting and that sort of thing, and then it also gives the commission the power to deny a grain dealer license to any applicant whose primary party, that is their CEO or, in the case of an individual, the individual, whose primary party has been convicted of a felony financial crime. And I just wanted to ask you, to get some intent on the record, what might be included in a felony financial crime? Would it be fair to say that that involved any felony that was done for the reason of financial gain, to include, for example, theft by deception or giving out false information or filing false reports or forgery or any crime, regardless of its category, if its purpose was financial gain? Is that what is meant here by felony financial crime?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kremer, would you yield?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes, I will. Yes, it is. It could be embezzlement or something like that, that they had a history of something like that, then they would be denied the license.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So it's your intent that that would have very broad application, well, to anything that really involved trying to get financial...

SENATOR KREMER: Correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...trying to acquire financial gain illegally.

SENATOR KREMER: That's correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you, Senator. That's all, Senator Cudaback.
