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administration. We have, to my knowledge, no opposition to the amendment and that we have used this time wisely. We've gone back and forth with several redrafts. At this point, I have given a handout to you. It's two-sided, and on the one side it says "AM1421" and it lists a brief description, section by section. My staff, Kate Allen, put it together for me because I tend to be visual, so that I can actually see what's being exempted and what the bill does. And so the boxes outline the sections, but they also list the exemptions and we have expanded exemptions based upon concerns that were expressed. We had some concerns from the Transportation Committee that Senator Baker expressed regarding the roads contracts. Senator Baker, I believe, is on board and the Roads Department is with exempting out those roads contracts. We also had some concerns that were brought to us by the Banking Department and Insurance. Some of those that could have been a problem were also exempted out. And I just spoke with the lobbyist and he thanked me for the language redrafting that we did so that their concerns were addressed. We also had some concerns that Senator Stuhr brought to us regarding the Investment Council. We did exempt the Investment Council out, so the provisions for them and I think there's, again, some justification for some of these so that in the Investment Council area that money won't be sitting there waiting for approval and not be invested, so there won't be a time delay. And the Investment Council does seem to have good scrutiny over those contracts already and they do make an annual report to us, so I think that was a legitimate exemption as well. But you can look at the back side of what the handout is that I gave you and it shows the exemptions and it shows how through, and I didn't list all the drafts and all of the stages that we went through, but that we have continued to make some additional exemptions and, with those additional exemptions, address the concerns that people have. With this amendment, I think we have reached that proverbial compromise that we can all live with at this stage and there is one area where we are looking at, perhaps on Final Reading, pulling the bill back to clarify some language regarding the Health and Human Services contracts. Other than that and rather than rushing that, at this point we have addressed all of the concerns and to my knowledge the members of the LR 399 Task Force, which included Senator Wehrbein from the Appropriations Committee, Senator
