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preference, as Senator Schimek said, to sit down and to draft it correctly to take in not only...into account of some of the care providers. That isn't the only aspect we need to deal with. We still would end up bringing the bill back from Final Reading. Rather than do something now and trying to craft something that may or may not deal with the problem and then still have to bring the bill back, I would rather that we waited. And I'm not sure where Senator Byars is on the floor, but, Senator Byars, you're listening and if I could ask you a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Byars, would you yield?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR PREISTER: Senator Byars, I pledge to you that I have not overlooked anyone intentionally or even unintentionally to my knowledge, but that I would be willing to bring this bill back and intend to bring it back from Final Reading after this is...this amendment is adopted, and if the body so chooses to move it. And that gives us all a little time to look at it and make one final adjustment that does what you want to do and that maybe a couple other people would like to do, that we all agree with. Would that be acceptable to you? I give you my word, my pledge, that I will do that.

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, Senator Preister, with your pledge to bring the bill back for appropriate language to address these issues, yes, we will. I will not introduce my amendment and we will hold that until Final Reading.

SENATOR PREISTER: And would you agree that it's probably better that we sit down and do it together rather than try to rush something now?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay. Thank you very much, Senator Byars. With that, I appreciate the body's indulgence. It is good that we're discussing this.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
