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at, to make determinations, and to aid the process so that if we can individually find cost savings we can do that. At this time of budget challenges, I think that's especially important, and it is one where I think we need to be especially careful. We're also going to be providing that if a bid at an agency level is prereviewed, it will be prereviewed by Materiel and any changes proposed to the final contract shall be reviewed by Materiel Division before the signature, another opportunity for some scrutiny, another pair of eyes looking at the contract and making a determination which gives us that added accountability. The bid will be filed with Materiel for discussion and final dissemination on the web site, and access of that will be there for the vendors so that they see, in most cases, with some exceptions, what is out for bid, so if they want to bid on it we provide access to more of those providers and perhaps can be more competitive in the bid process and, again, get better cost-competitive contracts. The agency directors will keep accurate records of those contracts and the process, ensuring that the contract terms are complied with. Again, some additional scrutiny, some additional assessment, and I think makes for accountability. In the contracts there will be no payments made until the actual services are delivered, getting back to accountability again, and I think that's the hallmark of what we're attempting to do. One of the things that's in the bill says that the agencies may not structure these contracts to avoid the requirements of the legislation. That's one of the things that Senator Jensen was very concerned about and we have that in the bill. So the contracts can't be structured to avoid these requirements and, yet, we allowed flexibility so that where there is an opportunity and does need to be an exemption those exemptions are made. The preprocess, which is a real thing that I've been working on, is there. Any contracts for service which is now performed or...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR PREISTER: ...or has been performed within the last 12 months by a classified personnel who may or potentially had been replaced will have close assessment to determine if that is the most cost-effective approach to letting the contract or not letting the contract, whether we're saving money, whether there
