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committee and, Senator Chambers, you'd be recognized to speak on that motion. And let me bring us up to date on that for just one second before your time starts. You may proceed, Senator Chambers. I'm sorry, I was going to try to find out whether you had previously spoken on this, but proceed with...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I believe on a new day we start all over, don't we?

SPEAKER BROMM: We are.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Tyson a couple of questions.

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes, you may.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator...

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Tyson, would you yield, please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Tyson,...

SENATOR TYSON: I'd be delighted to, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...who was the sheriff you said sent you the communication that you shared with us?

SENATOR TYSON: G.H. Woodgate, W-o-o-d-g-a-t-e.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what county is he from?

SENATOR TYSON: Kearney County.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Had he testified on this bill, do you know? Because I'm not familiar with his name.

SENATOR TYSON: No, he has not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was he invited to the meeting that he said resulted in the vote to express opposition to this bill?
