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the weapon and there's any damage to person or property, it is a part of this that that must be reported so that it can be investigated by law enforcement. Part of the bill, and I'm going to quote this to you, Senator Thompson: a statement that the applicant understands the use of lawful force for the protection of himself or herself, his or her family, his or her property, pursuant to Sections 28-1406 through 28-1416, and the applicant's signature. In other words, he has to swear that he has that.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. May I follow up? I guess it's my time anyway. But I'm referring to the chief of police in Omaha's concern that there isn't in LB 265 provisions for technical proficiency with a firearm nor any requirement that permit seekers are to be trained in the current Nebraska statute as it pertains to justifiable homicide and various degrees of assault. So are what you telling me, that that is in the bill?

SENATOR TYSON: I'm telling you that the chief of police of Omaha hasn't read the bill.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. So you're saying that's in the bill.

SENATOR TYSON: In the committee amendment. This would be...

SENATOR THOMPSON: Oh, okay.

SENATOR TYSON: ...AM0768. It has "knowledge and safe handling of handgun ammunition; safe handgun shooting fundamentals; a demonstration of...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR TYSON: ...competency with a handgun with respect to the minimum safety and training requirements; knowledge of federal, state, and local laws pertaining to the purchase, ownership, transportation, and possession of handguns."

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. So that's in...that's the training description, or is that the thing that the person signs?
