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SENATOR MOSSEY: ...was also? Their mainly made up of...command officers make up their majority of that association.

SENATOR MINES: Right, so they are the leadership of the departments. Is that right? I mean is that a fair statement?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Correct. So, basically, they're saying that it's more dangerous for the officers, and the officers are saying, for themselves, and if the officers were saying it was dangerous they'd be out in opposition even stronger than the Police Chiefs' Association, is the point I'm trying to make.

SENATOR MINES: But the Nebraska Police Officers' Association is opposed to this legislation.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Correct, but they're mainly made up of command officers.

SENATOR MINES: Okay.

SENATOR MOSSEY: So I was just wondering if you would know...if you knew why...

SENATOR MINES: No, I don't know why.

SENATOR MOSSEY: ...a chief would say it was more dangerous for the officers than the officers themselves.

SENATOR MINES: No, I'm sorry, I don't.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Okay. Thank you. I would yield the rest of my time back to Senator Tyson.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Tyson, you have two minutes and ten seconds.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I have a question of Senator Mines.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Mines, would you yield, please?
