their Department of Public Safety, that's been the case. They have issued. And also from the data that I presented from various states where crimes have been committed, they went back and looked and realized that there had been all sorts of either errors made or plea bargains or whatever. It's very difficult by just using a criminal history record check to be able to make that determination. And remember we would be a shall issue state. They also have concerns about locations and how many weapons will be left in cars, as we talked about before. But they also have some situations that they list specifically. One has to do with the stop and frisk search that has been held by a Florida court as illegal. Police officers observed a bulge in the clothing of a suspect, frisked him and recovered a handgun. Subsequently, because of Florida's concealed weapons law, it allowed...that allowed persons to carry concealed weapons, the officers lacked probable cause that a crime was being committed, thereby letting an armed criminal go free. They talked about issues such as this. Police are called to a store or a mall where people are pointing guns at each other. How are you going to determine who's the bad guy? Again, they talk about the issues of the mentality that you need to have to possess a weapon of deadly force. The more intelligent the individual, the more they are aware of the finality of the act. Hesitation provides for the opportunity that weapon be taken away from them and used against them. And again they say what they recommend, and they recommend citizens carry pepper spray. It is a nonlethal form of self-protection. It is also a forgivable form of defense. If it is used on an innocent person, a child or other family member, that person recovers quickly and without injury, unlike a bullet. Other forms of nonlethal devices, such as...and I don't know what this is, t-a-s-e-r,...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...tasers, should be explored prior to enacting a concealed weapons law. I think what we should be doing here is considering the position that we put our law enforcement officers in, that we put the sheriffs in, in a shall issue permit situation, but also the fact that these kinds of laws are being pushed around the country for a lot of reasons.
